Evaluation of 2020-2021 Sports Premium Funding impact

<p>Activities and improvements during the year 2020/21</p>	<p>Over the last academic year, sporting opportunities have come in a very different form. Due to COVID many competitions offered to the children have been virtual and in house. We have tried to deliver lots of opportunities through house competitions and key stage competitions to ensure all children are still experiencing competitive sport. The children have enjoyed the different challenges and many have had a go at new team sports. We have had organised fundraising events including the Santa run which was a huge success and everyone thoroughly enjoyed.</p> <p>The children were able to get involved with sport at lunchtimes through the daily class play leaders and through CS who organised house competitions every half term. CS training for staff helped to deliver quality PE. Staff have been sent on forest school training so that more children can have the opportunity which has promoted mental well-being. Virtual CPD has also been offered to support different areas in the PE curriculum.</p> <p>Due to Covid-19 swimming was not able to happen this year. A new trim trail has been installed by the playground which has promoted children having fun and being active at lunchtimes. Virtual competitions have happened during lunchtimes and we have entered a number of competitions in our local area which the children have enjoyed being part of. During Lockdown competitions like the 21 active challenge took place and we had a number of successful winners for the local area. Despite lockdown we continued to offer opportunities and online lessons for the children to enjoy at home.</p>
<p>Overall evaluation of impact on subject</p>	<p>The sports coach has continued to have a massive impact on the teaching of PE. By joining Charnwood and aiming for the Silver Sports award (postponed for a second year running) children have experienced and been offered more sporting opportunities (even though they have been virtual) which has helped with self-esteem and confidence. Due to the Covid-19 situation not all events were able to take place but the children have been challenged to virtual PE competitions and PE has been continued to be promoted through home learning.</p> <p>The forest school training continues to support the mental health and physical health of our children and we are working towards our vision of each class to have a trained forest school teacher.</p> <p>The additional of the new Trim Trail on the playground has given the children an opportunity to continue to develop physically in a fun way during lunchtimes and is again aiding our vision to make lunchtimes a real opportunity for physical development.</p>
