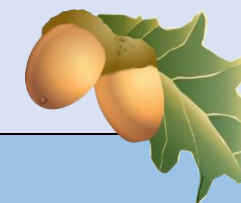
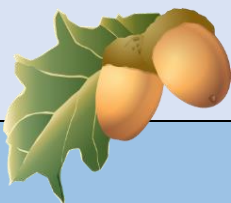

Evaluation of 2017-18 Sports Premium Funding impact

Activities and improvements during the year 2017/18

Over the last academic year, the children have been offered various opportunities to support development and improve confidence. Year 5 and 6 have been given the opportunity to go to the climbing wall in Loughborough to learn new skills and build confidence. This has also given them the chance to get involved and learn about something new. In year 1 and 2 the children went on an outdoor activity day where they learnt how to kayak and took part in other outdoor activities which they wouldn't normally be able to do.

	<p>The whole school has been able to take tennis lessons during the summer term which has enabled children to experience a new sport, learning new skills and techniques. During the winter and Autumn term, the children in years 1-5 have taken part in swimming lessons to gain water confidence and progress to new levels.</p> <p>New PE equipment and tools have been bought to help with the increasing class sizes and to support the outdoor activities within the forest school area which has been a great success and a wonderful learning opportunity for forest school and topic.</p>

Through sporting opportunities, events and trips the children are tackling new challenges and learning the importance of teamwork, self belief and a love for sport.
