Happy new year to you all, I think I speak for most of us when I say let's hope that this year is a positive one and maybe we will have some normality soon.

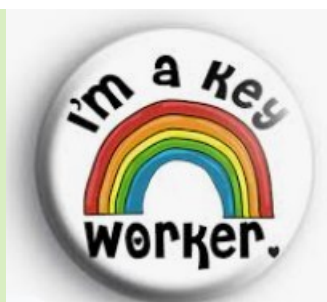
I do hope you have all had a lovely Christmas and managed to spend some time over the Christmas period recuperating and with family.

I do apologise for changing some of your Christmas plans due to class bubble closures but it was important that we keep you and your families as safe as possible. I'm sure it wasn't the news you wanted to hear but I hope you can understand that the isolation was essential.



On Monday this week we were preparing to welcome all of our children back into school again and then by 8.00pm all of those plans were scrapped as Boris Johnson made his announcement to close all schools and lock us down. Communication on the evening was extremely difficult as our Teacher's to Parent's system went down due to all of the other head teachers trying to communicate with their families last minute. Thank you to those parents who WhatsApped and Facebooked to direct our families to the Google classroom to pick up my email response to the announcement.

I'm sure there must be parents thinking 😞 Home Schooling Again! But please be kind to yourself. The most important thing is that your children are safe, well and happy. If you find the work too much then stop and take a break and just do what work you can do. Don't panic that they will fall behind because every child across Europe is in the same position and they will make progress again! Home is the safest place for them to be right now even if it doesn't feel that way.



We have been inundated with critical worker requests for care at school this lockdown. We have requested initially that it is parents that are both key workers as we are a small school with 8 teaching and support staff in total. Therefore we can only have two adults in the hall with the children as the rest of the staff must be able to plan, prepare and mark quality lessons on the Google Classroom for all of our children. We are a small school and have a small staff team compared to larger primaries. Of course we will try to accommodate any request if we can.

I believe it is vital that our teaching staff are focused on quality lessons to help you as much as possible at home and to support our children and their learning.

Again I ask critical worker parents to not send their child into school if they are unwell or someone in their household is unwell as this will close the critical worker bubble and puts children, staff and their families at risk.

Staffing Update

I just wanted to start by sharing how amazing I think the staff at the school are. They have been working incredibly hard now since the first lockdown in March and have worked tirelessly for your children.

They quickly adapt from teaching in the classroom to the online classroom and have at times been understandably worried as we had our first case in November but they have always been so positive and worked as a team.

They worked incredibly hard to create a normal-ish Christmas in school for the children in the final week and have had 1 days notice to change all of their lessons plans this week to adapt them for the children. Miss Hellowell had even purchased an Octopus and all sorts of sea creatures ready to share with her children on Tuesday to launch the topic but now her freezer is full after the lockdown was announced!

Mrs Plummer

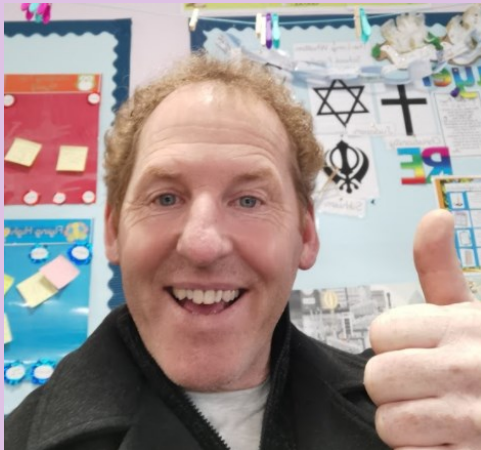
